Community Initiatives Against Family Violence (CIAFV)

Community Initiatives Against Family Violence is a dynamic, voluntary, Edmonton and area initiative comprised of government departments and not-for-profit agencies working towards a collaborative, coordinated, community response to family violence and bullying.

CIAFV Definition of Family Violence

A systematic pattern of abusive behaviors
(thoughtful, planned, intentional)

Where the relationship is characterized by
intimacy, dependency or trust

Where the abusive behaviors are used to
gain power, control and induce fear

Adopted October 9, 2001

The Work of CIAFV

Since 1999, CIAFV has been involved in:

- Assisting agencies to develop family violence protocols affecting over 150 programs
- Assisted in the development of 9 Linking Protocols
- Trained over 1500 staff and volunteers in family violence
- Provided public education opportunities on family violence
- Developed a network to support agencies

Objectives:

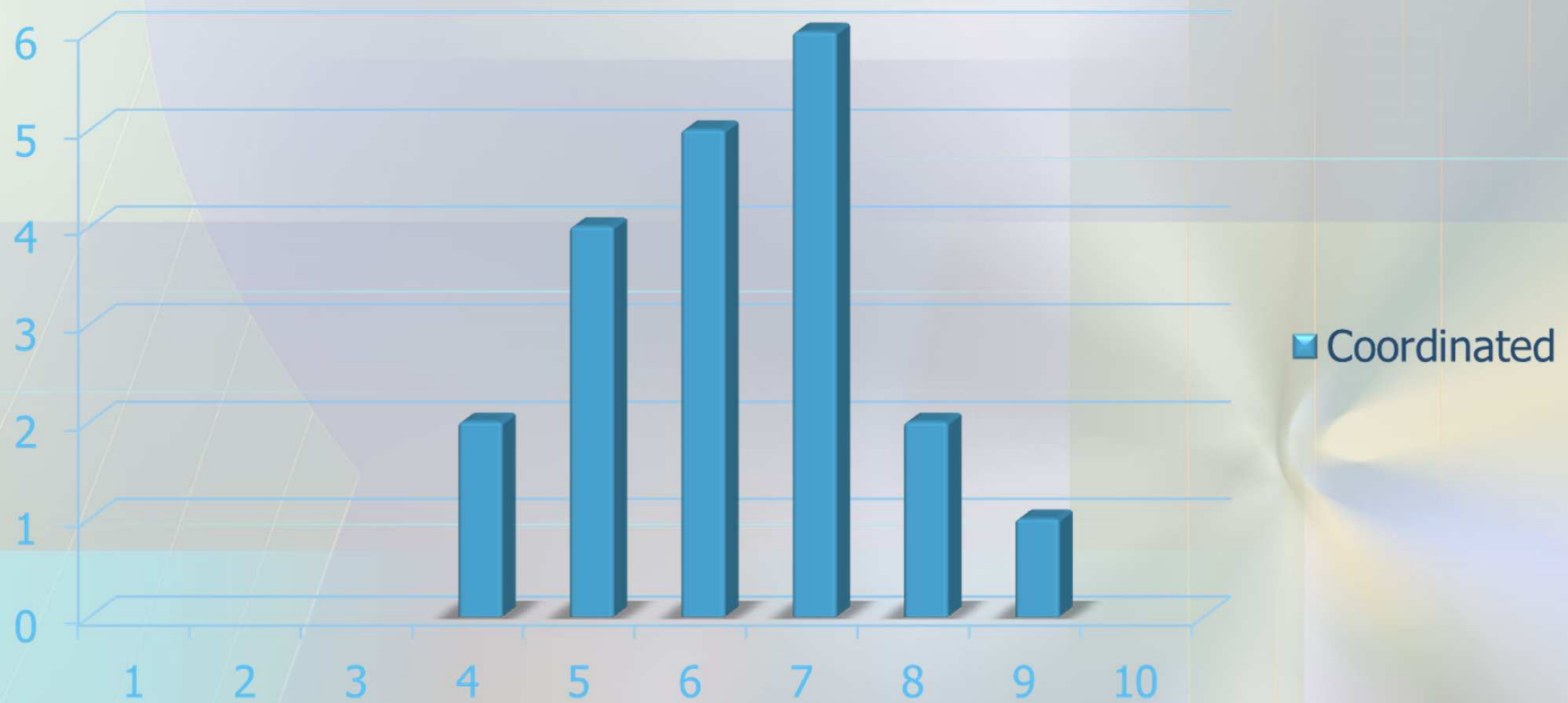
- To be able to measure the effectiveness of our collaborative response (Rating of Coordinated Efforts Tool).

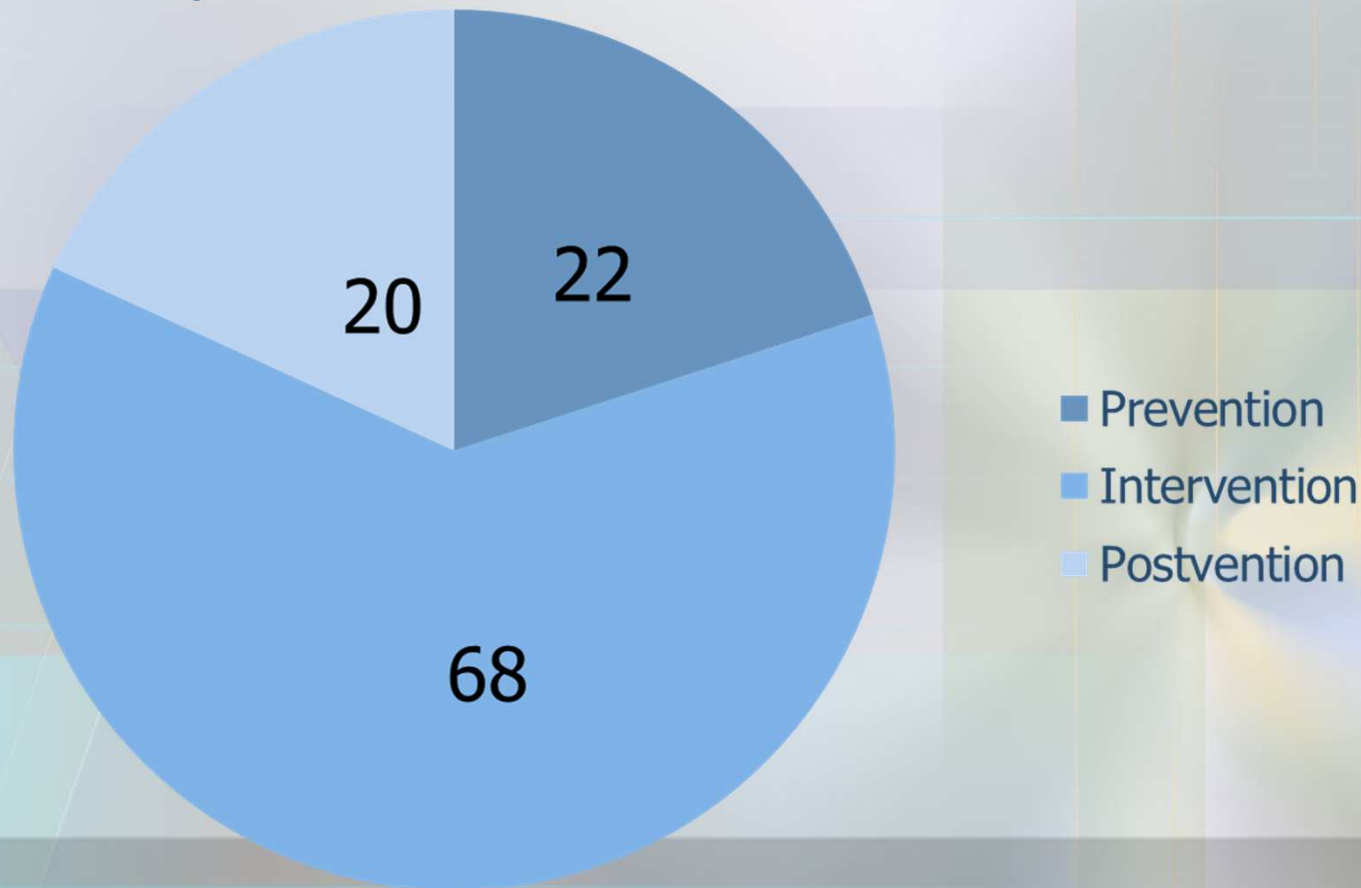
