



PROFILE of North East Mapping and Action Team (N.E.M.A.T.)

Goals:

- To increase professionals and residents awareness and utilization of community agencies and organizations supporting children and families in northeast Edmonton.
- To identify neighborhoods of high social vulnerability.
- To heighten professional and community awareness of the “informal” resources or assets in each neighborhood.
- To coordinate and target services to children and families most needing support.
- To make changes, as necessary, to the location or type of service provision to better serve children and families most needing support.
- To develop closer working relationships among service providers in the northeast.
- To recognize and support the contributions offered by informal resources in the northeast.

Expected Outcomes:

- Families living in northeast Edmonton will receive more effective referrals to service providers.
- High risk families will be better supported to experience a continuum of linked services as they transition to wellness, rather than accessing services from different agencies at repeated periods of crisis.
- Professionals will have a heightened awareness of how to support and encourage “non-professional grass-roots” community assets to meet family needs.
- Increased opportunities for immigrant, refugee, and isolated families to access services that are sensitive and appropriate to their needs.
- Strengthened relationships among professionals providing services in the north east.

A Collaborative Community Mapping Planning Process

Joint Commitment:

- May 2005: Presented to Partners East End and Community Builders at East NCCYF.
- June 2005: Identified: what are the boundaries, why is the group interested in mapping, and the name of the partnership as “NorthEast Community Mappers”.
- September 2005: Coordinator is hired.
- September 2005: Presentation to MLA’s and assistants.
- September 2008: NEMAT partners re-confirm commitment to work together to share knowledge of community and plan collaboratively based upon this knowledge.

Community Profile:

- October 2005: Broke into sub-committees: demographic, agency, mapping, informal assets and discussion around mapping resources.
- December 2005: Entire group met to review maps, receive report from Coordinator and determine a plan to gather resource information.
- February 2006: M.A.P.S. presented final set of maps to large group.
- June 2006: Coordinator submits final report and provides agency/resource list for review.

- July 2006: Changes made and final versions of Resource Directory and related information sent to group from Coordinator.
- November 2008: Presented demographic maps of 2006 Census data.
- June 2009: conducted trends analysis from maps
- September 2009: Maps analysis identified gaps in profile information
- January 2010: Critical service populations indentified
 - New families/parents/young children
 - Aboriginal community
 - Newcomer community
 - Low income families.

Community Engagement:

- September 2006: N.E.M.A.T. partnership meets to discuss next steps in Community Profile - Partnership renamed "NE Mapping and Action Team".
- September 2006: Review maps to identify additional useful demographic information to map. Themes identified were: Immigration, Youth, Housing, Addictions, Basic Needs, Mental Health, Aboriginal.
- September 2006: Analysis of maps, themes continue.
- December 2006: 75 people signed up to attend Community Meeting to review work to date and sign up for work in one of the theme areas.
- December 2006 to February 2007: Four Action sub-groups created to work on NEMAT areas of interest.
 - Mental Health
 - Basic Needs
 - Addictions
 - Cultural Diversity
- February 2007: The subgroup focusing on Cultural Diversity merged with North Central's subgroup which is focusing on the same topic. They renamed themselves the "Northerners".
- April 2007: CPEF funds available to hire administrative support to main group and the sub-groups.
- January 2010: Early Childhood Services in Abbotsfield/Rundle sub-group is formed.

Action:

Northerners Sub-Group

- The overall goal is to create and enhance opportunities to work with four communities (Kurdish, Afghan, Sudanese and Somali) without duplicating efforts and overburdening leaders/resource people. The Northener's can add other communities as need arises.

Mental Health

- The overall goal of this sub-group is to enhance knowledge between service providers who offer mental health resources and programs to children and adults.
- Spring 2008: members are in the midst of planning a resource fair in conjunction with Clareview Headstart.
- Spring 2008: Working towards involving newcomer populations in a Mental Health First Aid program. This initiative will seek to reduce stigma and increase access to mental health services.
- Fall 2008: sub-group concludes
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Basic Needs

- The aim of this sub-group is to pull together service providers and faith agencies in order to reduce duplication and introduce agencies to each other.
- Winter 2007: Several members of the sub-group have attended the interfaith agency meetings.
- June 2008: Homelessness Mayor's information meeting.
- November 2008: Mental Health Workshop on ethno cultural issues (70 participants registered).

Addictions/Family Violence

- Educational sessions regarding family violence to service providers.
- November 2008: Family Violence Workshop held hosted by Stronger Eastwood Families Network.

Reflection:

- In the Spring and Summer 2009 the NEMAT underwent a review of work to date and identified accomplishments.
