Goals:

- The overall goal is to create and enhance opportunities to work with four communities (Kurdish, Afghan, Sudanese and Somali) without duplicating efforts and overburdening leaders/resource people.
- The Northerner's can add other communities as needs arise.

Expected Outcomes:

- Increase and improve relationships and collaborative efforts between social service agencies/organizations and with community at large.
- Enhance the awareness of existing resources and supports.
- Improve the capacity of agencies/organizations to serve Immigrant/Refugee families in a more culturally competent manner.
- Increase the accessibility to existing services and resources.
- Identify the unique needs and hopes of Immigrant and Refugee families.
- Explore and support development of new services where gaps exist.
- Provide opportunities for information sharing at monthly meetings.
- Identify community issues. Communicate concerns to appropriate decision makers. Support the community in advocacy efforts

A Collaborative Community Mapping Planning Process

Joint Commitment:

- February 2007: Subgroups of the North Central Community Mapping Committee and The North East Mapping And Action Team focusing on the needs of Immigrant and Refugee families join together.
- Terms of Reference created (last updated May 2008).

Community Profile:

- Maps from both the North Central Community Mapping Committee and The North East Mapping And Action Team are available for use.
- October 2009 – Review of Maps (Immigrant & Refugee Category) – identified request for new Map based on “Country of Origin”, not just “Language Spoken”

Community Engagement/Action:

- June 2007 - Hosted two public events ‘School is out-What to do!’ Information session.
- July 2007 - Developed a ‘buddy system’ as a new way to remain connected with cultural community leaders that respect the time constraints of the leaders.
- September 2007-A 2nd set of Multicultural workshops for human service providers.
- September 2008 -2 Resource Fairs at NorQuest College
- January 2008 - Consultation with community leaders re most important and effective actions to support; guest speakers – members learn about new initiatives & can provide feedback
- March 2009- Planning for future Financial Literacy Fairs.

- March 2009 – Guest Speaker – Multicultural Health Brokers Co-op – Under & Unemployment within Edmonton Ethno-cultural communities
- May 2009 – Participated in Resource Fair at Londonderry Mall
- May 2009 – Hosted Financial Literacy Resource Fair – Abbottsfield Recreation Centre
- October 2009 – New action items – List parenting programs for newcomers, continue with Financial Resource Fairs, advocate for better Joint-Use Agreement terms
- November 2009 – Financial Resource Fair – Duggan Community
- December 2009 – Guest Speaker- EFCL – Pilot Soccer Program for Refugee Children
- February 2010 – Guest Speaker – Edm Community Services – Multi-cultural Room approved for new Clareview Recreation Centre
- March 2010- Joint-use Agreement Pilot Project approved for Immigrant groups needing space
- May 2010 – EMNC – Board Development Workshop for Immigrants.
