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Building Bridges Family Violence Prevention Continuum of Services

Health Promotion

- Positive behavior reinforcement
- Universal service delivery
- Low cost and broad reach

Prevention

- Negative behavior avoidance
- Targeted at high prevalence populations
- Low cost and broad reach

Early Intervention

- Early identification of potential issues
- Selective and indicated treatment
- Targeted at those with single risk factors or population risk factor combination
- Moderate cost and reach

Intervention/Postvention

- Emergency/crisis treatment
- Severe and chronic problems
- Targeted at those with multiple risk factors or in immediate need of protection
- Highest cost – narrow reach



Intimate Partner Violence Tiered Response

Primary

A contributing role to supporting secondary agencies in addressing situations of Intimate Partner Violence

Secondary

Agencies within Fort Saskatchewan that work collectively to remove barriers in Intimate Partner Violence situations

Tertiary

Crisis Response to Intimate Partner Violence

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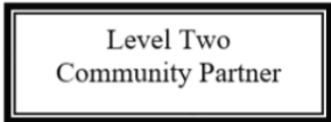
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Appendix D: Level One Community Partner Response Flow Chart
