Formerly the Immigrant Sub-Committee, the Mill Woods Cultural Diversity Collaborative (MWCDC) was formed in 2006. M.A.P.S. Alberta Capital Region facilitated a discussion within the Mill Woods community under the Mapping and beyond initiative, and one of the top-three needs identified was to address immigrant-related issues Mill Woods community members were facing, such as:

- Increasing service providers' knowledge of diversity issues in Mill Woods;
- Strengthening relationships and collaborative efforts of service providers in Mill Woods;
- Enhancing awareness of existing resources and community supports in Mill Woods;
- Increasing accessibility of existing community services and resources in Mill Woods;
- Identifying existing/emerging diversity issues and concerns in Mill Woods;
- Identifying new ways of delivering services to diverse communities in Mill Woods.




Mill Woods Cultural Diversity Collaborative:



November 1, 2018 Dialogue: Leefield Community League




"We need more such conversations."

"Yes! Break the wall!"




Reflections:
